

DOO-WOP ITALIANO







"The vocal harmony groups of the 1950s, later known as "doo-wop groups," were rock and roll's most significant form of urban expression. Created and developed to its highest level by African-American youth, doo-wop was soon adopted by Italian-American teenagers living in city neighborhoods who came in contact with this musical form through radio, records, stage shows, and street performances. By fusing this African-American music with their own rich musical and cultural heritage, the Italian-American groups were able to produce their own version of doo-wop, which was much more than mere imitation.

Among the more prominent Italian-American doo-wop groups of this period (including their first hit, the year, and their place of formation), there were the Crests ("Juanita"/"Sweetest One," 1957, Lower East Side of Manhattan), Danny and the Juniors ("At the Hop"/"Sometimes When I'm All Alone," 1957, South Philadelphia), Dion and the Belmonts ("I Wonder Why," 1958, Belmont section of the Bronx), the Elegants ("Little Star," 1958, South Beach section of Staten Island), the Capris ("There's a Moon Out Tonight," 19591, Ozone Park section of Queens), the Mystics ("Hushabye," 1959, Bensonhurst section of Brooklyn), the Passions ("Just to Be with You," 1959, Bensonhurst section of Brooklyn), the Earls ("Life Is But a Dream," 1961, the Bronx), Nino and the Ebb Tides ("Those Oldies But Goodies," 1961, the Bronx), the Duprees ("You Belong to Me," 1962, Jersey City), the Classics ("Till Then," 1963, Brooklyn), and Vito and the Salutations ("Unchained Melody," 1963, Brownsville and Canarsie sections of Brooklyn).

.....In-between these two contrasting worlds, there was also a remarkable generation of Italian-American singers who came to the fore and were transforming American popular music by bringing to it a certain Italian look, style, and, of course, musicality. These artists included Dean Martin (Dino Crocetti), Perry (Pierino) Como, Tony Bennett (Anthony Benedetto), Frankie Laine (Francesco Paolo LoVecchio), Jerry Vale (Genaro Louis Vitaliano), Jimmy Roselli, Vic Damone (Vito Rocco Farinola), Julius La Rosa, Al Martino, and, most influential of all, Frank Sinatra."

Thumb Print Fig Cookies
1/2 cup isosalted botter softened


