FESTIVAL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

This is a call out for those of you who would like to get involved with our Italian Festival which will be held on Sunday, October 13th. We have many opportunities to showcase your varying talents, knowledge and volunteerism. The Festival is a major fundraiser for our Foundation. Volunteers are needed for our raffle, our boosters, manning our booths, setting up tables and chairs, decorating and so much more. If you can help at all, we will be very grateful. We need help prior to the Festival as well.

We have need of the following talents in our CULTURAL CENTER which will be held in the Hudson River Maritime Museum Barn:

PASTA MAKERS - demonstrations of doughmaking, assorted pastas along with your family story.

STORYTELLERS - if you have knowledge of the history of Italians locally (Brickyard, Lace factory, Cement works, shirt factory, canal work, restauranteurs, etc.) or Italian history worldwide. Also, stories of your family life or typical old world Italian family life. We would like to share those stories with our community.

WINEMAKERS - we would like to have a display of homemade wine making with explanations of the varied tools and processes of making wine (No drinking allowed in the Cultural Center). Limoncello makers also accepted.

ARTIFACTS - if you have interesting articles that you would like to display which represent our Italian culture including old photographs, lace work, handcrafted items etc., we would love to display them.

FUN THINGS - old Italian toys, card games, games that you played inside or outside that were unique to Italian culture or neighborhoods. Maybe you could teach an Italian card game.

This is our third year with an Italian Culture Exhibit, so we are open to suggestions.

EARTH DAY, APRIL 22, 2024

No Ice, No Dryer, No Problem

April 22nd - "Earth Day," and coming to mind was something my son Ben (in his teen years) once remarked to me. It was on one of our Italy vacations and he had said something like "Italians are like the original hipsters". What he was referring to was his observations on how our Italian cousins living in southern Italy lived their day to day lives a little differently than we Americanos did. Their food was always extremely fresh, as "farm to table" as could be with almost nothing wasted. It really had to be this way as there was almost no refrigeration; no ghiaccio (ice) to my sister Camille's and my dismay, as we are big fans of icy cold drinks especially in the summer heat. A simple thing by American standards, became a very valuable commodity for us and the small amounts of ice the freezer could produce was not to be frivolously wasted. The basic reason is that there's less electricity - so no big giant American side by side refrigerator to dole out copious amount of cold water and ice at the push of a button. No big clothes dryers to have freshly laundered clothes within a few hours.

I remember getting a call from the small hotel nearby where some of our other American cousins were staying with the hotelier (who really spoke no English) was trying to explain to the cousins were staying with the hotelier (who really spoke no English) was trying to explain to the cousins why they couldn't get their laundry back overnight. The simple explanation once translated was that clothes had to dry outside on a line in the sun. The same for taking a shower - no hot water heater except for what was produced by a garden hose run circuitously across the roof. So obviously there was only hot water during the day. When these same cousins we're visiting with us at Christmas in Brooklyn, Nicole and I took them to Dyker heights to see the unbelievable display of Christmas lights by the Italian homeowners, all trying to outcompete each other (truly crazy, beautiful, stupendous if you haven't had a chance to go & see.). Our cousin Lucca's biggest exclamation in his broken Italian accent - "How is it possible for Americans to have all the electricity to create this!" electricity to create this!"

So yes, things have changed - today there's a bigger refrigerator with more ghiaccio available, a small hot water heater so quick short hot showers can be had. But clothes are still dried in the sun, and best of all the food is still the freshest farm to table, and just so much better than what we find here in America. In fact Italy created a "Slow Food Movement."

The slow food movement, which began in the 1980s in Italy, ignited the wider slow living movement as we know it today. The slow food movement celebrates local food traditions, protects edible biodiversity and advocates for fair, clean and regenerative food production. It encourages farming of plants, seeds, and livestock characteristic of the local ecosystem. The Slow Food Movement is based on three interconnected principles: good, clean, and fair food. So young Ben might have been right "Italians are the original hipsters" and maybe even the first

environmentalists.

So Happy Earth Day fellow Italiani Maybe dry the next batch of clothes outside in the sun, and cherish those nice icy drinks!
